

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Building A Better Wisconsin Political Action Committee (BBW PAC) and the Builders Direct Fund Conduit (BDF Conduit)

- Anyone can make a contribution to the Building a Better Wisconsin Political Action Committee (BBW-PAC), member or non-member.
- If a nonmember makes a contribution to the BBW-PAC you will need to get their home address and occupation. (Recent law change: name and address of employer is no longer required.)
- Only active WBA members can make a contribution to the Builders Direct Fund Conduit (BDF).
- We advise that most contributors make their contribution to the BBW-PAC unless they are active givers to those running for state assembly, state senate or other State of Wisconsin offices.
- Those active members contributing to the BDF must put at least \$100 into the fund when donating at a local event.
- Also, those active members contributing to the BDF must supply an active e-mail address if not already on record
- Anonymous contributions can be taken up to \$10 to the BBW-PAC. However, if you know the identity of the
 contributor even if it is under \$10 state law now requires that we must have the name, address and
 occupation of the contributor and include it on the next report.
- Cash contributions of up to \$100 can be accepted with name, address and occupation of the donor.
- All contributions to BBW PAC and BDF must be from individual personal funds and cannot be reimbursed by a business or other individual:
 - Personal checking account
 - Personal credit card
 - Cash can be accepted up to \$100.00 (this has changed do to a recent law change)
 - Recent law change: Single member LLCs in which the single member is an individual or LLCs taxed as a partnership can now make a contribution to the BDF or the BBW PAC which will be recorded as a contribution from the individual who is a member of the LLC.
- By agreeing to the terms and conditions I confirm the following statements are true: 1.) I am a United States citizen. 2.) This contribution is made from my own personal funds and is not made from the general treasury funds of a corporation or labor organization. 3.) This contribution is made on a personal credit card and not a corporate credit card or the credit card of another person
- Contributions from a corporation are prohibited and state campaign contributions are not tax deductible.
